DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY IS APRIL 19th. "Jesus, I trust in You."

On this Sunday after Easter we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy - a continuation Easter Week of celebrations with a deliberate focus on the mercy of the Lord Jesus! This feast is born out of tradition of the Church and the image of the Divine Mercy, with instruction given to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska as recorded in her Diary.

Pope Saint John Paul II, at the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Cracow, Poland on June 7, 1997, offers to us these words, on the power and necessity of the Mercy of God: "Those who sincerely say 'Jesus, I trust in You' will find comfort in all their anxieties and fears...There is nothing more man needs than Divine Mercy - that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights to the holiness of God.
