#### **REFLECTION**

Have you ever opened an email or a text and had to read it over and over again, because it's just too overwhelming to comprehend? My cousin Alan Talluto celebrated his 62<sup>nd</sup> birthday on Sunday, October 4, 2020. On Tuesday on his way home from work, riding his motorcycle, Alan was hit by a distracted driver. His injuries were life threatening. He was literally broken from head to toe. Both ankles are broken, he had to have emergency surgery for his shattered hip and most devastating were three brain bleeds, which led to concerns of brain damage. We are a big, faith filled family with a huge network of friends. Quoting another cousin "There has been literally an army praying for him across the country".

Now, about that text too overwhelming to comprehend. As I am preparing this newsletter, I receive in our family group chat this unbelievable message from his brother Dennis. Alan's wife Lesa called him and after a very brief greeting handed the phone to Alan who SPOKE..."Hey Denny... The conversation he described as GREAT. "He was a little groggy and gravelly in the voice - but full on language and vocabulary" From concern about critical traumatic brain damage, he took a major turn for the better overnight. After the accident, he was on life support, could not breathe on his own, numerous broken bones, and a swelling head injury. Four days later, he is sitting up and having a conversation with his brother.

We saw how prayer is helping our brother and friend Larry Rossi return to health. Now, with Alan, this is nothing short of a miracle. I have said rosary after rosary these past few days. I wasn't alone. That Army of prayers was answered. A common response to the good news in our group chat has been "PRAISE GOD". We know Alan is in for a long road to recovery and his full health is not assured. We know that God is with him and Lesa. God is with us. Last month I described prayer as a gift from God. He planted a seed in my mind to prepare me for what was to come. God Bless us all and have a wonderful faith filled month.
