THE NEW EVANGELIZATION AND THE KNIGHTS

Over the course of the last few years I've had people ask me how they should view the "new evangelization" effort and Pope Francis' call to become missionary disciples. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35) It is by being engaged, Catholic, men of charity that we fulfill our baptismal promise and call of a missionary Church. 

SPELLING BEE UPDATE!




FIRST IN LINE AWARD


