


OUR KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS TABLECLOTH ARRIVED.

ASHES



DEACON CHUCK

Soon many Catholics will receive ashes to kick off Lent. As we go about our business that first Wednesday of March, we will see many bearing the mark. Although it makes my heart glad, I often wonder what's behind their display of piety, in turn, what's behind mine?

The practice of wearing ashes comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God. The wearing of ashes is an outward sign of the grief we bear for having sinned and caused division in our relationship with God. Like the people of Nineveh, we look to the Lord, asking for mercy and pardon from our transgressions (Jonah 3:6-10). Or so it should be.

Ask yourself, when I receive ashes, why am I receiving them? Is it because of a sense of duty? Is it because, as a Catholic that's what's expected? I don't want to go against the grain. Personal remorse for my sins has nothing to do with it. It's what I was taught you do on Ash Wednesday and that's the way it is.

Perhaps, I receive ashes to wear like a badge of honor. Like the Pharisees and Scribes who widened their phylacteries and lengthened their tassels (Mt 25:3). Is it a demonstration my great piety or an admission of my sinfulness to the world? Pride or humility? The person looking at me won't know, but inside I should.

On Good Friday we will commemorate our Lord's passion as he continues to be that great atonement for the world's sinfulness to which we are a part. As we approach Ash Wednesday in the coming weeks, let us take the time to prepare ourselves so that when we don ashes it's for the right reasons. It will prove to make Lent more meaningful




