

As our world in the north opens up to new life, we too should consider opening up our lives to being the Catholic men that we are noted for; renewing what made us become Knights in the first place.



## K of C Senior Men's 2022 Golf League

This is a contract, League. League must pay up front golf fees. The Golf Course (Riverview Highlands) has raised the golf and cart fees from last year. The golf cart fee is \$6.00 per person and two people to one cart unless your partner is walking.




