The support and relationship with the school is strengthening. We reestablished the K of C scholarship for needy students at St. Pius and I would like to continue strengthening that scholarship.



THE SHOT HEARD AROUND THE WORLD

Many of us enjoyed this past 4th of July weekend as we celebrated our Independence from oppression and tyranny that was prevalent in the new Americas. In truth, the Declaration of Independence in 1776 was not the beginning but rather the result of many skirmishes and battles already fought since Lexington and Concord back in April of 1775.

The Supreme Court overturning Roe v Wade last month can be viewed the same way, both as a start and a continuation.

We can liken it to the Battle of Lexington and Concord, which came to be known as "the shot heard around the world." Like Lexington and Concord, this landmark decision with its ramifications will have rippling effects across the globe. So it is the start of something new for many less than 50 years old.

But it is also a continuation. The decision, like the Declaration of Independence, is the undoing of an injustice that started long ago. Namely, the realization by our highest court, like our Founders, that everyone is "endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights that among these are <u>life</u>, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

Brothers let us be cognizant that this war is not over, even though we have won a major victory. Although, and rightfully so, we celebrate July 4, 1776 as our day of independence because of the Declaration, the truth of the matter is, the war did not really end until the Treaty of Paris in 1783. Hopefully this small historical fact will keep us sober to know that our work is not done.

As Knights, we must be vigilant, faithful to the cause, standing up for those who cannot, and be the voice of those unable to speak. In many ways it's just the beginning. "Trust in God and keep your powder dry." (Oliver Cromwell)

REFLECTION

How many times have you encountered a reading from mass in your life? A particular passage of scripture or an anecdote from the homily presents itself in a real life situation specific to your life. For me it happens often enough to notice, but not frequently enough. They would occur more often if we were more open to seeing them and if more of the lessons from the readings took hold.

We are constantly reminded of how God wants us to live. Sometimes these scenarios are played out in little nudges, sometimes they are giant billboards with clearly spelled out instructions. In hindsight I have missed both through distraction and willful blindness. The result would always have been better if I had taken the Lord's guidance.

What if you could make the occurrence of those lessons more prominent in your everyday life and your natural reactions more aligned with God's will? It's a simple solution, but not an easy one. Start going to daily mass. Pray to be more open to hearing God's will. My life dramatically improved when I stopped thinking of the Bible as a bunch of ancient stories that had no relevance to modern life. I was humbled by the discovery of God's Word and the many church scholars who poured over the smallest detail of each book. My encounters with the weekly mass readings became more relatable and alive.
