K of C COUNCIL 3956 OFFERS HELP TO FLORIDA CHURCH IN AFTERMATH OF HURRICANE IAN (Respectfully submitted by Anthony (Tony) Chirco, Editor and P.R. Director)

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini church is located in Parrish Florida. The hurricane hit the memorial garden and devastated its beautiful flowering plants and trees. The garden has been a source for many community worshipers to find comfort in peaceful prayer.

On business and family trips to Florida, St. Cabrini has been our home away from home. The Pastor, Fr. Joseph, like our Fr. Suresh cares deeply for his parish. He has estimated the damages to be between \$35,000 - \$40,000.00. Having learned of the devastation, I reached out to their local council Grand Knight Hector Morales to offer our assistance. Our own GK Mark Garcellano has also spoken with him. Plans are being discussed among our council officers to raise money through fund raising activities. As we begin this process, we will be reaching out not only within our local council here at St. Pius, but throughout the district.

In the weeks ahead, we will be requesting help from brother knights in whatever way you can to assist us. Imagine what it is like to have faced this devastation and its aftermath. Parishioners there have had their own homes pounded by the storm. These very people that the parish would rely on to help rebuild the destruction have themselves had damage to their homes. Any help we can provide will help. Any financial help we can give, will help to ease the burden of restoring their beloved memorial garden.


TIME
