REPORT FROM GRAND KNIGHT MARK GARCELLANO

My Fellow Brother Knights! Let me begin by thanking the membership for allowing me to be one of the delegates representing the Bernard P. O'Brien Council at the 123rd Michigan Knights of Columbus State Convention. As was in recent years, the convention was held on Mackinac Island at the Grand Hotel which will continue to hold the convention through 2030.

On Wednesday morning a Mass was held at St. Anne's Church. After a Mass, there was a procession with the Eucharist to the Grand Hotel, about a mile away. At the Grand, the Eucharist was setup up for Adoration. In the afternoon, there was a convention opening mass celebrated by Archbishop of Archdiocese of Detroit, Most Reverend Allen Vigneron in the Grand's theatre. The convention's opening meeting was held later that night. Here are some quick highlights-

- Globally, the Order membership grew to over 2,070,000 members
- Life insurance in force grew to \$126.1 billion USD
- The Order raised over \$3 million USD to ASAP (Assistance Support After Pregnancy)
- The Order raised \$20 million USD for relief of war-ravaged Ukraine.
- The Order distributed 149,000 coats to kids.

Here are some quick Michigan State Council highlights-

- Over 1 million hours of Charitable service were volunteered.
- \$6.5 million USD raised for charity.
- 10,872 coats were distributed for kids.
- \$171,000 USD raised for ASAP.
- All 7 bishops from the 7 Michigan Diocese supported the state convention.
- Supreme Senior Vice President Membership/Marketing Mark McMullen was a special guest of the convention.







CONGRATULATIONS TO BROTHER RAY BILYK!

Awards were handed out Thursday beginning in the morning with a convention Mass presided by Bishop John Doerfler from the Diocese of Marquette. Later in the morning, an awards presentation was held. Our Worthy District Deputy Ray Bilyk was Awarded the Golden Knight Award! Congratulations Brother Ray!

Later Thursday morning there was a living Rosary conducted on the front lawn of the Grand. It was beautiful! In the afternoon we attend the diocese Caucus Meetings to discuss Michigan Council initiatives and goals.

ADORATION AND RESOLUTION

Being a Knight helps make a better man, husband, and father which in turn improves the family which also in turn improves the Catholic Church. Friday began with a convention Memorial Mass presided by Bishop Jeffrey Walsh from the Diocese of Gaylord. Later that morning, the closing meeting was held. The state officers were re-elected to their positions and resolutions were voted on. One verbal resolution of note brought up by the State Deputy Christopher Kolumjec, was the need of an increase in state taxes due to rising costs of inflation of 1 dollar per period (summer and winter). In all, the current \$5 per period to \$6 per period is a total annual tax of \$12 per council member. In the end the delegates voted to pass the tax increase.



His story related to a retreat that he went on called the "Emmaus Walk".

Finding and seeing Jesus in the sharing of the Bread and in Scripture. My Dad talked a lot about going fishing with us but didn't do much, he worked pretty hard trying to support our family. But we did do a little fishing with him and I know it pleased him and me. My brothers--- God bless our brothers---I would say were pretty decent fisherman all with different types of experience. My older brother used to take developmentally disabled guys fishing as often as he could, and they loved it! By invitation, by wanting to be invited, and just go fishing! Bunch of great guys. You know when Jesus called His first Apostles, the first seven,

I believe. They were wiped out from fishing all night, catching nothing, and wrapping it up, cleaning their nets. The crowds were pressing in on Jesus because they wanted to hear Him preaching and teaching. Jesus sees a couple of boats tied up at the shore and sees an opportunity to get a way from the crowd so He asks Simon to take Him out a ways so He can teach from the boat.

When He is done teaching, He tells Simon, "Let's go out to the deep and lower your nets for a catch". Whaaat! Jesus ,we've been out all night and nothing, but OK then, we will drop the nets, and then, Whaaat! The amount of fish was so great the nets began to break. They had to call for their buddies in the other boat to come help them and they filled both boats. Really scared Simon Peter, fisherman by trade, never seen anything like this.

Now this is a Fish Story! Simon Peter wanted Jesus to leave him because he said he was a sinful man and Jesus told him not to be afraid that he will be a catcher of men. Believe the Fish Story! They left everything there and followed Him.

My life changed forever in an exam room in Royal Oak a little over three years ago. There was a pulsing heartbeat in the grainy mass of an ultrasound. I'd seen still ultrasound photos taped to the refrigerators of family members and friends who were expecting. The early ultrasounds always looked like blurry black and white blobs to me. Even in something the size of a grape that day, the heartbeat was undeniable.
