Membership - Handling Objections I'm too busy to join

How often have you asked someone to join and their response to you is... "I'm too busy". Here are some suggested responses you can give to overcome this obstacle.

- **24 Hour Knight** Supreme has a great pamphlet you can order (for free) that shows men they only need to spend 24 hours a year on Knights activities. Everyone has 24 hours.
- There's no additional time required Many men in the parish already donate a significant amount of their time to church activities. Church Choir, usher, Eucharistic Minister, etc... Just become a member (to show your support) and just keep doing the things you're already doing. Nothing more.
- **E-membership** The Knights created a type of membership for people like you. Just become an e-member (for free) to show you support the Catholic Church. You don't need to do more. Then, in the future, if your situation changes, you can volunteer and be more engaged.
- The Knights should complement your life, not complicate it. Get involved only if and only when you have time. If you're busy. That's OK. Just being a member is helpful.
- **Have a voice** The knights have a voice in Congress on many issues impacting our lives. As a member, you share in strong Catholic values and we can represent you.



HOLY DAYS

Words are powerful and sometimes induce an untended result. Take for example the phrase, "Holy Day of Obligation." The last one we celebrated was the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Aug 15). The next one will be the Solemnity of All Saints (Nov 1). Holy Days outside of regular Sunday Liturgy are intended to offer special celebrations for the great things God has done for us through Jesus and the saints. As good Catholics the expectation is that we attend the Mass and so the word "obligation" proceeds what is celebrated.

Though not meant to be, when the word "obligation" is attached to anything, for some it brings about a negative connotation. To be obliged to do anything seems like an invasion of personal freedom. The word often carries the baggage of insinuating the task is something that is expected and must be done whether the person feels like it or not. When viewed this way, the true value of the solemnity is lost; it becomes another choir and leaves a bad taste in your mouth.

If you suffer from this misguided negativity, I suggest when it comes to Holy Days to view them not as obligations but rather opportunities. An opportunity to come to before the Lord in an extra special way; contemplating what makes that solemnity distinct; reflecting on that particular mystery of our faith or remembering that particular person and the traits that made them a saint. These prayerful reflections will hopefully inspire all of us to become more holy ourselves and bring to fulfilment the purpose for the celebration; the goal of the Holy Day; the intent of the Church.

If we consider being heirs to eternal life, can we ever have too much praise and thanksgiving to God for all he has done? When viewed with the proper frame of mind, positivity can turn the stoney heart of even the most reluctant and bring about a greater holiness for which we should all be striving.

I don't think there is a person here who went through an exemplification without listening to the part about unity and strength; seeing the example of the single string verses many strings; yet here we are again tonight with about the same numbers we have every meeting. I'd like to offer up a reflection from Scripture that talks about this very thing. The early Church struggled with the same problem. It's short but offers wisdom in answer to our dilemma. Just listen to it in its whole, then I'll take each line and expound a bit.

Hebrews: 10:23-25

Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy. We must consider how to rouse one another to love and good works. We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another.

Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy.

It is our faith in Jesus Christ and his Church that gives reason for our existence and the driving force in all we do. It's true we are Knights but it's only by grace we are called to service in this capacity. We must "Keep Our Eyes Fixed on Jesus." If we fail to do that then we risk becoming just another non-profit and what we do just another obligation instead of "for the glory of the Lord."

We must consider how to rouse one another to love and good works.

It is not enough to say I'm a Knight, we must truly be Knights; active in charity and good works when permissible. Sadly, it appears many of our brothers are just names on a roster. For many of us new members, we don't even know who our brothers are. Perhaps we can come up with a picture directory, so we all know who to approach and rouse by lighting their hearts afire and get them to help bring about the Kingdom.

We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another.

We need to seriously look at how we reach out and engage fellow Knights. Those of us here know how important these meetings are; it's a source of bonding and establishes comradery in our council, just as our parish community which strengthens the Church.

Friendly reminders in passing conversation help. We don't always need some grandioso announcement to get our brother's attention; sometimes just a friendly invite is more effective. We need to be initiators. When we see a Knight we haven't seen at a meeting or event in a while, invite and encourage personally.

The use of Scripture is just as valid a tool for the Knights of Columbus as it is for the Church or any Catholic. We need to remember that and search it often for the answers to our troubles as well as our joys.
