To Downriver Pro-Life Friends,

Thanks to the financial support of Upper Downriver and Southern Downriver Right to Life of Michigan affiliates, four charter buses of 134 people (and others who drove separately), went to the Michigan March for Life in Lansing on Wednesday, November 8. Participants included a 4.5 month old baby, a few others in their 80's and many in between.

There were students from Gabriel Richard High School, St. Frances Cabrini Academy and High School and students from southwest Detroit, Catholics and Evangelical Christians. We joined nearly 5000 others on the lawn in front of the Capitol, braving the cold, wind and rain. Everyone was happy to be among so many witnesses to the value of every human life from conception to natural death.

Speakers at the Rally included Barbara Listing, President of Right to Life of Michigan. She announced a <u>legal challenge</u> to the constitutionality of Proposal 3 was filed that very morning. Michigan's Pro-Life legislators stood shoulder to shoulder on the steps of the Capitol. They included two Downriver Representatives: Jim DeSana (District 29 which includes most of Taylor) and Jamie Thompson (District 28 which includes Brownstown).
