

#### ADDRESS FROM GRAND KNIGHT MARK GARCELLANO

Happy New Year! Thank you to all who participated in recent events including John Tibbs Concert, Knights Christmas social at Rhapsody Restaurant and the Brunch with Santa Claus in the St. Pius Activity Center.

At our Christmas social, I prepared a State of the Order address for all attendees. I would like to share that with you here below. It is followed by a First Quarter Initiative addressing exemplification schedule and programs planned for the first quarter that will work well as recruiting events.

#### STATE OF THE ORDER (December 2023)

Worthy Brother Knights, Ladies and honored guests,

Vivat Jesus!

I would like to give a brief state of the order for the Bernard Patrick O'Brien Council #3956.

St. Pius X is a microcosm of the Roman Catholic Church, similarly, the Bernard P. O'Brien Council is a microcosm of the Knights of Columbus. Worldwide, there are more than 2 million brother knights and more than 7000 councils. In the state of Michigan there are approximately x brother knights and 429 councils. At our council level we have 114 brother knights.

Last year, our council donated more than \$20,000 dollars to charity and 1556 volunteer man hours. This year our council is projected to donate more than \$22000 dollars to charity and 1795 volunteer man hours.

In terms of volunteer hours and donated funds worldwide, the knights have donated more than 185 million dollars and 76 million volunteer man hours.

So, what does that mean? Every brother knight who takes time to volunteer, every lady who takes time to volunteer even if it's just 1 hour of their time is making a difference. If you look at that time collectively, it adds up to the very large number of 76-million-man hours.

Therefore, I would like to take the time now to thank all of you for gathering today and celebrating our council. Furthermore, I would like to thank all of you again for volunteering. Because without your help, we cannot conduct all the programs we conduct (we have more than 76 events this year).

As part of my thanks, I would like to recognize individuals who support our council. The first is Father Suresh, who is also a brother knight. Without his support, we could not conduct all the events we do at the church and school. The next is our parish secretary Lou. Thank you for coordinating the social hall, activity center, collecting donations and being an advocate for the knights. The next is Laura Howard another advocate for the knights, who supports us especially when it comes to announcements at Mass of our events. Next, I would like to recognize individual knights. Deacon Charles Dault receives the Above and Beyond Award for his promotion of our council events to the congregation. Walter Kabalka receives the Officer's Dedication Award for 15 years of service as Treasurer of our council. Dennis and Debbie Hamilton received the Feeding the Needy Award for 14 years of service and counting for collecting food for the pantry. Anthony Chirco receives the Newsletter Excellence Award for an outstanding newsletter.

Again, I really appreciate all your support. I look forward to finishing out the fraternal year strong with all our remaining events and continuing with our initiatives which are to support the church, the school and grow our faith. Thank you again and Merry Christmas!


