STAYING THE COURSE

By the time this article is published we will be about halfway through our Lenten journey. For many, when we first made resolutions for change, our commitment was much like the first disciples, enthusiastic, dedicated, and hopeful. After all, who wouldn't want to follow the Lord, especially after such a joyous Christmas season followed by miracle after miracle.

But now that the sacrificial realism of Lent has tempered our honest initiatives, our demeanor may be one that's more apathetic, inconstant, and pessimistic.

Like Peter, we might be apt to say, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing should ever happen to you" (Mt 6:22), rather than face our own suffering. In other words, Lord, if you don't have to suffer, neither will I.

Being a Christian is easy when things go well and there is much joy and happiness. It's easy to be on board when there isn't a cross. It's why many of our separated brethren preach only the resurrected Christ. Who doesn't enjoy the redemption of Easter morning?

But when reality doesn't match perception, when discipleship becomes lack-luster, when piety becomes drudgery, then staying the course becomes difficult. When we feel this way, we need to increase our prayer and fasting so we will receive the grace we need resist the Evil One as did Christ in the desert and in Gethsemane. As Jesus reminds us, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me" (Mt. 6:24).

During this time of Lent, we must not lose heart and fall back to where we came from. We must stay the course if we are to grow in holiness by rejecting things that separate us from God. Jesus tells us, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God" (Lk 9:62). Therefore, my brothers, keep your eyes fixed on the prize.

LECTURER'S REFLECTION

As we look across the American landscape, we see what's going on, we hear what's is being said, and our reason tell us that truth and reality is not always present. Many influencers, the new buzz word, depict and encourage words and actions that differ from what we've been taught.

Without a doubt, Christianity is being attacked not only as a direct onslaught, but subtlety from person's you'd least suspect. Those who mistakenly give into the tempter in order to be considered politically correct or progressive.

The question is, where are we progressing to? That, my brothers, is exactly why as we prepare for Easter, I encourage each of you to take up a commitment to reading Scripture daily as part of your Lenten observation and sacrifice. It doesn't have to be much, perhaps just a verse or two or short chapter.

The idea is to let God's word be in our minds regularly so that we are not caught unawares through ignorance. As Micah clearly states, "You have been told, O Man, what is good, and what the Lord requires of you; Only to do the right and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God." (Mic 6:8)

As Catholic Gentlemen, Knights, we are expected to be prepared so as to be able to combat the forces of darkness that seem to be pulling so many into the pit. Make no mistake about it; we are fighting spiritual warfare whether we want to or not.

We will prevail in the end if we but learn to see, hear, and speak correctly. That comes from knowing Scripture. As St. Jerome said, ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Let us be in the know. Amen?




FELLOWSHIP
