I remember early in diaconal formation, My spiritual advisor asked, "How's your prayer life." When I told him about my daily prayer regiment, he seemed concerned whether it was really helping me become holier. I thought it was, but over the years I've found perhaps not. At least not as well as I perceived. Here's what I mean.

In How to Pray by Fr. Joseph Nassal, and Nancy Burke, Fr. Joe writes,

Prayer is neither a spiritual exercise nor a human convenience...is not an obstacle to overcome, a competition to be won, an object to be manipulated or an intellectual concept to be analyzed. It is a human necessity and Divine commandment. We hunger and thirst for a connection with something infinitely greater and more encompassing than ourselves and our human relationships.

The exquisite union of the human and Divine in a relationship of prayer is an unmerited gift from God, not a thing we acquire under our own power. We are invited into the Divine relationship...whether our hearts are open to it or not.

God does the initiating because God is there before us, waiting, even before the idea of prayer is part of our consciousness. God speaks to us from within...always anticipating us—our needs, our actions, our petitions—always waiting for us to answer the invitation.

So, it goes without saying, as with all good relationships, sometimes we have to be quiet and let the other person do the talking. Spend some quiet time with the Lord.

I think that maybe that was something that Saint. Paul shared in his letters. Ahhh, HOME with the heavenly Father, we all long for it. May we all find it!
